



Instructor Index: Items 1.1 through 1.5



- 1.7) Please take a moment to explain your recommendation (in the item immediately above) by providing specific reasons or examples.
- I would not recommend her to non-traditional students, or to students enrolled in a minimester. While she is very knowledgeable and willing to allow for practical application of knowledge and skills acquired by students, she does not seem to care much for the student as a person. Therefore, any student with any other obligation or who likes a learning environment where they can share ideas should not enroll in her course.
- Perhaps the quickness of the class had an impact on how I feel about the learning experience. In my opinion there was too much reading expected for the short amount of time for this class. I believe this class in not well suited for a mini mester format. I also did not see the advantage in paying for or using the \$50 clicker. Also some last miniute changes in what was to be turned in was bothersome but luckily most of us used our phones to put together a list of references to turn in. I guess on another level this is no different than what we might expect in some work places.
- She has was way of seeing things and granted she is a PHD. While participating in group activities she would interrupt to say where we should be going and at times we were headed there just not as fast. Would have liked her critic at the end instead of during sometimes. Would have liked for her to hear us out
- The instructor's experience and knowledge provide a great foundation to the course; however, the level of teaching is not always beneficial to students of all levels and backgrounds. Developing a way to communicate and teach important information to the students in a matter in which is understandable would be more beneficial and successful for learning the material.

### 2. The Learning Experience.

- She was very knowledgeable on all subjects but the fact that some of us in this Cohort are not BSW has some of us a little lost sometimes. I feel this course is not a good choice for a 11 day mini-mester.
- Skills labs, exam reviews were perfect
- The video role play project was extremely helpful to bring to life the material in the course. The course books and articles were beneficial.
- Which attributes or the course and/or the professor **did not help** you learn the material? (When the course is next taught, what might be revised?)
- More explanation was needed on every assignment. For example, i would have been helpful if the professor explained what she was looking for in the video role play project. While it was listed in the syllabi with guidelines and the book provided the material, having her openly discuss the expectations would have cleared confusion.

The professor is very knowledgable and keeping in mind that not all students have experienced the material would have helped me personally with learning the material instead of feeling lost.

Discussion of the skills labs and what was expected before breaking into groups would have clarified the material and given us clear measures to address when working on the skills.

\*\*This is not a class that should be offered in a 11 day format\*\*

- The clicker that we just had to have that cost 50.00 bucks and we will only use it for her class and because of the change of companies we all had to get it new resale is under 30.00. We could have saved that money
- There was too much reading in the short amount of time. I found myself up sometimes at 3 or 4 in the morning reading but could not retain a lot because of the amount of material covered.
- inability to complete a question before she interrupted with an answer or took the time out to understand the concern or confusion of a student, workload for online course was so much work in so little time it took away the ability to truly learn for having to hurry and complete the assignment even though it was not for a grade, professor talking the entire 3 hours.
