Course Description:

This course serves to instruct students in marching percussion skills.

This lab will supply a basic foundation of technique to improve each student's musicianship through rehearsal and performance. Students will become familiar with effective marching pedagogical techniques, and apply those techniques to performances throughout the season.

Required materials:

- 1. Sticks, mallets, and small accessories as found in the UTA Percussion Required Materials List.
- 2. Music as supplied by the instructor.

Course Objectives:

- 1. Establish a foundation of technique to approach the demands of the marching band music.
- 2. Learn the various brands in the percussion industry.
- 3. Contribute to the marching band's performances at the highest level.
- 4. Encourage each individual's artistic and technical development while working toward goals for the group.

Attendance:

At The University of Texas at Arlington, taking attendance is not required. Rather, each faculty member is free to develop his or her own methods of evaluating students' academic performance, which includes establishing course-specific policies on attendance. As the instructor of this section, class participation will weigh heavily in the grading process. Therefore, attendance is required at <u>all</u> rehearsals, sectionals, and performances. An unexcused absence will result in a lowered grade by one letter. The instructor retains the right of determining whether an absence is excused or unexcused. Emergencies are handled on a case-by-case basis. An absence from a performance will result in a failing grade.

Additionally, tardiness not only hurts the individual student, but also harms learning environment for everyone else in the ensemble. Considering the amount of information in this course of study, you are expected to be in the rehearsal with all materials ready to go at the beginning of class. Should a student arrive after the warm-up regimen begins, it will be logged as a tardy. Two tardies will equal one absence.

Please communicate conflicts as soon as possible.

Grading:

Grading will be based on class attendance and participation, as well as the individual's outside preparation of music. An unexcused absence will result in a lowered grade by one letter.

Drop Policy: Students may drop or swap (adding and dropping a class concurrently) classes through self-service in MyMav from the beginning of the registration period through the late registration period. After the late registration period, students must see their academic advisor to drop a class or withdraw. Undeclared students must see an advisor in the University Advising Center. Drops can continue through a point two-thirds of the way through the term or session. It is the student's responsibility to officially withdraw if they do not plan to attend after registering. **Students will not be automatically dropped for non-attendance.** Repayment of certain types of financial aid administered through the University may be required as the result of dropping classes or withdrawing. Final Review Week: A period of five class days prior to the first day of final examinations in the long sessions shall be designated as Final Review Week. The purpose of this week is to allow students sufficient time to prepare for final examinations. During this week, there shall be no scheduled activities such as required field trips or performances; and no instructor shall assign any themes, research problems or exercises of similar scope that have a completion date during or following this week *unless specified in the class syllabus*. During Final Review Week, an instructor shall not give any examinations constituting 10% or more of the final grade, except makeup tests and laboratory examinations. In addition, no instructor shall give any portion of the final examination during Final Review Week. During this week, classes are held as scheduled. In addition, instructors are not required to limit content to topics that have been previously covered; they may introduce new concepts as appropriate.

Emergency Exit Procedures: Should we experience an emergency event that requires us to vacate the stadium, students should exit the room and move toward the nearest exit, which is located underneath the east and / or west concourse. When exiting the building during an emergency, one should never take an elevator but should use the stairwells. Faculty members and instructional staff will assist students in selecting the safest route for evacuation and will make arrangements to assist individuals with disabilities.
