Course Information: HIST 4365 – History of Spain and Portugal (FALL 2017)

Meets MW 1-2:20 in UH 25

Course Description: The cultural, political and economic history of the Iberian Peninsula from ancient times. The medieval epoch; the Catholic Church; the overseas empires of Spain and Portugal, and their artistic achievements. The monarchist ideal, as well as political ideologies such as liberalism, Marxism, anarchism, and fascism. *In this course section, emphasis will be paid to Medieval Iberia (Muslim, Christian, and Jewish Iberia), the Age of Iberian Empires, and the Spanish Civil War.*

There will be a mix of lecture, discussion, film and other media, and in-class activities
